GREAT MEADOWS SNO-PARK CLOSED TO OVER-SNOW VEHICLE USE

Klamath Falls, Ore. - As of today, the Fremont-Winema National Forest has closed the meadow at the Great Meadow Sno-Park to over-snow vehicle use. The Sno-Park is located 35 miles west from Klamath Falls, Ore., or 30 miles east from Medford, Ore., on Highway 140.

“The heavy rain that the area received over the weekend melted the snowpack at Great Meadow,” said Michael Boles, Recreation, Lands and Minerals Staff Officer for the Klamath Ranger District, Fremont-Winema National Forest. “Currently, there is about two feet of standing water during the warmer part of the day, which freezes overnight, making treacherous conditions for over-snow vehicles.

The Forest would also like to caution snowshoers and cross country skiers that current conditions at Great Meadow may not be optimal for these activities either. A public announcement by the Forest will be made when snow levels are deep enough to reopen the meadow to over-snow vehicle use.

An over-snow vehicle as defined in the 2005 Travel Management Rule (36 CFR 212, 251, 261, 295) is “ A motor vehicle that is designed for use over the snow and that runs on a track or tracks and/or a ski or skis, while in use over the snow.” These vehicles must be less than 60 inches gross width and less than 1,200 pounds dry weight.

Still in effect through April 30 is the annual seasonal restriction of specific Forest Service roads that are designated as snowmobile trails. Additionally, the entire Lake of the Woods Resort is closed for the month of April to prepare for the upcoming summer season.

Joanne Baeth Quilts on Display at Two Rivers Gallery

Joanne Baeth of Bonanza, Oregon will be exhibiting three Collective Visions art quilts at Two Rivers Gallery in Chiloquin, for the month of April (beginning April 3rd).

Collective Visions is a group of art quilters who participate in a group project each year. Each person creates a design, enlarges it, and divides it into sections. The sections are distributed to the other members of the group who complete their section using any technique, fabric, fibers or embellishments that they choose. The sections are then returned to the original designer who sews them together and finishes the quilt.

Collective Visions gives us an opportunity as a group to explore fiber arts techniques and integrate other art mediums such as paints, inks and embellishments.



SEW TROPICAL is from a design drawn by Joanne Baeth. Each member of the art quilt group completed a section using only purples, greens and yellows. They were also asked to include a gecko. Techniques included texture magic, wool felting, fabric manipulation, thread painting and raw edge applique. Quilt artists were Joanne Baeth, Kathy Adams, Dona Ford, Susan Massini and Louise Page. Machine quilting was done by Joanne Baeth.



SUMMER FANTASY is a recreation of a water color painting by Bev Barmore, Joanne's sister. Silks, sheers, inks, paints, silk rovings and beads were used. Quilt artists were Joanne Baeth, Susan Massini, Cheryl Carbone, Dona Ford and Louise Page. Machine quilting was done by Joanne Baeth.



COLORWHEEL KALEIDOSCOPE was designed by Joanne Baeth. Each quilt artist was given the same sixty degree pattern and specific color instructions. Techniques included raw edge applique, decorative stitching, fabric paints and lots of glitzy embellishments. Quilt artists were Joanne Baeth, Dona Ford, Carole Bowen, Louise Page and Susan Massini. Machine quilting and hand beading around the outside edges was done by Joanne Baeth.

How to Report a Crime

It is likely, that if you are the victim of a crime, that the Sheriff's Department will not respond. This is because the Sheriff's Department is underfunded and understaffed, and not able to respond to crimes unless lives are in danger. But still, crimes need to be reported! They need to be tracked, and sometimes patterns can be figured out that might help apprehend a criminal.

All About the Chiloquin Food Pantry

How to sign up for Food Items

- ❖ If you need commodities and think that you might be eligible to receive foods at the Food Pantry, please drop by on the 4th Wednesday of the month between 10 am and 1pm to sign up. We are here to help those in our community who are struggling financially and although our supplies are limited, we are here to serve our community.

How to Donate to the Food Pantry:

- ❖ Drop-off times at the Food Pantry, opposite Kirchers: Between 2PM and 3PM on the Monday before the 4th Wednesday in the month or on the 4th Wednesday in the month at 9.30 AM.
- ❖ Non-perishable food items are always needed and can be deposited in donation barrels around town. They are at Kirchers, The Table, Chiloquin Community Church and the Community Center. More barrels will be placed during the Thanksgiving and Christmas seasons.
- ❖ Toilet paper and other personal items are always appreciated.
- ❖ Monetary donations can be put in Collection Boxes located at: Family Foods, the Library, Kirchers, Clyde's Market, The Table and the Williamson River Christian Fellowship.
- ❖ Checks: The Food Pantry is a non-profit organization and checks should be made out to "Chiloquin Care Program" and deposited in the collection boxes in town or brought to the Food Pantry. Receipts will be issued.
